Matthew 7:21-23 "Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but the one who does the will of My Father who is in heaven. On that day many will say to Me, 'Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in Your name, and cast out demons in Your name, and do many mighty works in Your name?' And then will I declare to them, 'I never knew you; depart from Me, you workers of lawlessness.'"

This verse shows that salvation is not about works or spiritual gifts, but about truly knowing Christ and being known by Him. These people were doing mighty works, yet they lacked the indwelling of the Holy Spirit—they were never truly saved. That's why He says, "*I never knew you,*" not "*I knew you once, but you fell away.*"

The same truth applies to the Parable of the Ten Virgins (Matthew 25:1-12). The foolish virgins had lamps (outward appearance of faith) but no oil (symbolizing the Holy Spirit). When the bridegroom came, the door was shut, and He told them, "*Truly, I say to you, I do not know you.*"

The key difference between a true believer and a false one is the indwelling of the Holy Spirit. As you said, even a witch doctor can perform signs and wonders, but that doesn't mean they are saved. The enemy can counterfeit miracles (2 Thessalonians 2:9), but he cannot counterfeit salvation.

Romans 8:9 says, "Anyone who does not have the Spirit of Christ does not belong to Him."

True salvation is about a relationship with Christ, not just outward works. That's why Paul tells us in 2 Corinthians 13:5 to "Examine yourselves, to see whether you are in the faith. Test yourselves. Or do you not realize this about yourselves, that Yeshua Christ is in you?"
