Scripture References:

- **John 14:27** – *"Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid."*
- **John 15:5-17** – *"I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing."*
- **John 13:34-35** – *"A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."*
- **Luke 10:25-37** – (The Parable of the Good Samaritan, teaching us to love and care for others sacrificially.)
- **John 15:9-17** – *"Love one another just as I have loved you."*

Here are **scripture verses** that support the message about being sifted by Satan and being called to suffer for the sake of others:

1. Sifted Like Wheat by Satan

- **Luke 22:31-32** – *"Simon, Simon, Satan has asked to sift all of you as wheat. But I have prayed for you, Simon, that your faith may not fail. And when you have turned back, strengthen your brothers."*
 - Jesus warns Peter that Satan seeks to test and shake his faith, just as Satan does with all believers.
 - **Job 1:8-12** – *(Satan's testing of Job)*
 - Satan challenges Job's faithfulness, and God allows Job to be tested. Yet through it all, Job remains faithful and is restored.
 - **Ephesians 6:11-12** – *"Put on the full armor of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms."*
 - This reminds us that Satan constantly seeks to attack and sift us, requiring us to stay strong in Christ.
 - **1 Peter 5:8-9** – *"Be alert and of sober mind. Your enemy the devil prowls around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour. Resist him, standing firm in the faith, because you know that the family of believers throughout the world is undergoing the same kind of sufferings."*
 - Satan tries to shake us, but we must resist and stand firm.
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2. Called to Suffer for the Sake of Others

- **Philippians 1:29** – *"For it has been granted to you on behalf of Christ not only to believe in him, but also to suffer for him."*
 - Suffering is part of our calling in Christ.
- **2 Timothy 3:12** – *"In fact, everyone who wants to live a godly life in Christ Jesus will be persecuted."*
 - Every faithful believer will face trials and hardships for the sake of Christ.
- **Romans 8:17** – *"Now if we are children, then we are heirs—heirs of God and co-heirs with Christ, if indeed we share in his sufferings in order that we may also share in his glory."*
 - Suffering is part of our inheritance in Christ.
- **Matthew 16:24** – *"Then Yeshua said to his disciples, 'Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me.'"*
 - Following Christ requires self-sacrifice and endurance.
- **2 Corinthians 1:3-5** – *"Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves receive from God. For just as we share abundantly in the sufferings of Christ, so also our comfort abounds through Christ."*
 - We suffer so that we may comfort others in their suffering.
- **Colossians 1:24** – *"Now I rejoice in what I am suffering for you, and I fill up in my flesh what is still lacking in regard to Christ's afflictions, for the sake of his body, which is the church."*
 - Paul expresses joy in suffering for the sake of others in Christ's body.
- **Hebrews 12:3-4** – *"Consider him who endured such opposition from sinners, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart. In your struggle against sin, you have not yet resisted to the point of shedding your blood."*
 - Jesus suffered, and we are called to endure as well.

These verses confirm that Satan **sifts us** to test our faith, but we are **called to endure suffering** for the sake of Christ and others. Stand firm, knowing that Christ is with you in every trial!

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Ephesians 6:13 (KJV):

"Wherefore take unto you the whole armor of God, that ye may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand."

Ephesians 6:13 (NIV):

"Therefore put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand."

This verse emphasizes the need for believers to **stand firm** in faith, resisting the attacks of the enemy by putting on the full armor of God. It encourages endurance, spiritual readiness, and unwavering trust in Christ during times of spiritual battle.

The Whole Armor of God

Ephesians 6:10-18 (KJV):

10 Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord, and in the power of his might.

11 Put on the whole armor of God, that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil.

12 For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places.

13 Wherefore take unto you the whole armor of God, that ye may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand.

14 Stand therefore, having your loins girt about with truth, and having on the breastplate of righteousness;

15 And your feet shod with the preparation of the gospel of peace;

16 Above all, taking the shield of faith, wherewith ye shall be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked.

17 And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God:

18 Praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, and watching thereunto with all perseverance and supplication for all saints.
