• Suffering is a test of faith and a way to participate in Christ's own sufferings.

6. 2 Timothy 2:3 (NIV)

"Join with me in suffering, like a good soldier of Christ Yeshua."


• Following Christ means enduring hardships as part of our spiritual battle.
